Little Demi Needs a Home



Most of the pets you've read about above were once considered hard-to-place, but are now treasured members of happy families. Can you help Demi find HER forever family?

Demi came to PAW in a weakened, emaciated state, just barely clinging to life. The little hound mix was on her last legs after months of trying to survive as a stray on the city streets.

When PAW volunteers rushed her to the vet, we discovered Demi was suffering from Ehrlichia, an infectious disease acquired from tick bites, and immune-mediated hemolytic anemia, a condition in which the immune system attacks the body's own red blood cells.

After blood transfusions and many weeks of intensive vet care, Demi was finally back on her paws again. However, she still needs a forever family, and has been seeking the perfect home for more than a year.

Demi is a medium-sized dog, weighing about 35 pounds. She is about two years old, walks well on a leash, knows how to "sit," and has gentle manners and sweet, soulful eyes. Demi has beagle-like markings on her face, while her body is mostly white with shiny bold chestnut spots.
